Volkswagen Settlement July 2018

Background

VW entered into settlement with USDOJ in 2016 to resolve Clean Air Act violations due to the automaker's use of software to cheat emissions standards

Settlement established \$2.7 billion Environmental Mitigation Trust for states to use on activities to offset excessive emissions; <u>Arizona's share is \$57 million</u>

Provisions of the trust limit spending to replacing or repowering eligible large trucks, buses, and other vehicles with new diesel, alt fuel or all-electric engines

Governor Ducey has allocated <u>\$38 million</u> of the VW air quality mitigation funds to purchase school buses

Anticipated Timeline

October 2, 2017 – Trust effective date established

November 2017 – State applies for beneficiary status

January 30, 2018 – Beneficiary status approved

June 7, 2018 – State submits the mitigation plan

August of 2018 – Trustee approves/denies mitigation plan; state begins accepting applications. Deadline for applications is Sept. 28.

November of 2018 - Awards made, funds available.

School district eligibility

The funding will be allocated to school systems in which at least 60% of students were eligible for free or reduced-price lunch during the 2017/2018 school year to replace qualifying diesel school buses that are at least 15 years old and have over 100,000 miles.

The number of buses replaced will be limited to 10% of each districts' bus fleet, with a minimum of one bus per district, and is expected to total over 310 buses statewide.

Eligible Activities

Repower or Replace:

Class 4-8 School Bus, Shuttle Bus, or Transit Bus (Eligible Buses)

Eligible Buses include those that are at least 15 years old and have over 100,000 miles.

Buses may be replaced by either diesel or alt-fuel (gasoline replacements are not eligible)

Vehicle Disposition (Scrapping)

The Beneficiary Agreement defines Scrapped:

Repower: "Shall mean to render inoperable and available for recycle, and, at a minimum, to specifically cut a 3-inch hole in the engine block for all engines."

Replace: "If any eligible vehicle will be replaced as part of an eligible project, Scrapped shall also include the disabling of the chassis by cutting the vehicle's frame rails completely in half."

Available Funding

Individual districts could receive either:

- 1. <u>Up to \$110,000 per bus</u> to purchase new diesel school buses; or
- 2. <u>Up to \$135,000 per bus</u> to purchase alternative fuel school buses.
- **Funding will be disbursed to the school district directly through an Intergovernmental Services Agreement and not to the vendor/supplier.**



State Goal of Reducing NOx Emissions

The State of Arizona is strongly encouraging public school systems to scrap and replace old and high pollutant emitting school buses with modern, cleaner diesel or alt-fuel varieties. To help support school systems with this endeavor, Governor Ducey has authorized the utilization of funding allocated from the Volkswagen Diesel Emissions Environmental Mitigation Trust (VW Trust) to fund the Lower-Emission School Bus Program.

The objectives of this program are to:

- 1. Focus on funding projects that replace older diesel-fueled vehicles and engines.
- Focus on vehicles, engines, and equipment operating or located in or near areas that bear a disproportionate share of the air pollution burden (priority areas), such as schools and environmental justice areas.
- Prioritize projects located in or near areas that are in nonattainment of National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS) for ozone, particulate matter (PM), or nitrogen dioxide (NQ2)
- Focus on projects located in areas with high population density and high traffic density.
 In Arizona, areas of high population density are often the areas with the poorest air ouality.

Availability of Funds

The amount available is \$20,000,000 and up to \$37,000,000, contingent upon availability of Funds.


Eligibility Requirements

Funding will be allocated to public school systems (both school districts and charter schools) that meet the following eligibility requirements:

- At least 60% of students were eligible for free or reduced price lunch during the 2017/2018 school year.
- Diesel school buses proposed for replacement must be owned by the school system, at least 15 years old, and have over 100,000 miles.

School systems meeting all eligibility requirements will initially receive an allocation for at least one replacement bus. After which, the remaining funds will be distributed across the eligible districts in efforts to attain up to 10% bus fleet replacement for the participating districts.

Under the requirements of the VM Trust, a "school bus" is defined as a Class 4-8 bus sold or introduced into interstate commerce for purposes that include carrying students to and from school or related events. May be Type A-D.



Summary:

Governor Ducey has authorized the utilization of State Trust Funds allocated from the Volkswagen Diesel Emissions Environmental Mitigation Trust to fund the Lower-Emission School Bus Program. Allocating \$37 million dollars of the settlement to replace Class 4-8 school buses in Title 1 School Systems across the state. The allocation of these funds to these replacement project will reduce NOx emissions and will support Arizona's goal of protecting our environment and the health of our citizens.

The funding will be allocated to eligible school systems (both traditional and charter) in which at least 60% of students were eligible for free or reduced-price funch during the 2017/2018 school year in order to replace qualifying diesel school buses that are at least 15 years old and have over 100,000 miles. The number of buses replaced will be limited to up to 10% of each districts' bus fleet, with a minimum of one bus per district, and is expected to total over 310 buses statewide. Funds will be distributed to ensure each eligible district receives an allocation for at least one bus if all eligibility requirements are met. After which, the remaining funds will be distributed across the eligible districts in efforts to attain up to 10% bus fleet replacement for the participating districts.
